



Why Is It Important for all of us to Register in the VACCELERATE Volunteer Registry?





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




Each one of us can contribute to the better and in-depth understanding of the COVID-19 immunity in the general population and in specific groups, including children, elderly, citizens with underlying conditions and under-represented minorities.

This effort will contribute to a better vaccination strategy and vaccine dosing in the future.





What is the Process of Registration?





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The steps for the registration:

- Click on the link: www.vaccelerate.eu/volunteer-registry (or QR code above)
- Select your language from the list
- Fill out a short (5-10 min) questionnaire and consent

By expressing their interest and by registration, the volunteers do not commit to take part in any study and they can cancel their registration as well as request their data to be deleted at any time.





What are the Data Collected in the Registry?



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- Age, Demographics
- Postal code, district, region or country
- Comorbidities
- Pregnancy
- SARS-CoV-2 history
- Vaccination history

The registry is aimed at all citizens including those with prior exposure to SARS-CoV-2 and / or prior COVID-19 immunisation.
